

Amendments to Category 1 Public Lottery Licence

1. In **clause 1.1** of the Category 1 Public Lottery Licence **delete** –

“**Category 2 Public Lotteries** has the meaning given in clause 4.3(2)(a).”

2. For **clause 4.1** of the Category 1 Public Lottery Licence **substitute** –

“**4.1 Number of Licences**

This is a Public Lottery Licence to Conduct the Authorised Lotteries, being Category 1 Public Lotteries subject to additions as contemplated in clause 4.3 and as otherwise varied pursuant to this Licence. Subject to clause 4.2, no other Public Lottery Licence will be in effect at any one time from 1 February 2015 for the balance of the Term.”

3. For **clause 4.3** of the Category 1 Public Lottery Licence **substitute** –

“**(1) Category 1 Public Lotteries**

(a) **Category 1 Public Lotteries** means Public Lotteries that were the subject of a Bloc Agreement applicable in Victoria as at 13 July 2005, namely those Public Lotteries currently being conducted under the Bloc Agreement names of Powerball, Oz Lotto, Soccer Pools, Saturday Night Lotto and Super 66.

(b) During the term of a Public Lottery Licence to conduct Category 1 Public Lotteries, the holder of that Public Lottery Licence may apply to the Minister to vary the Public Lottery Licence to authorise the Conduct of a new Public Lottery that may or may not be the subject of a Bloc Agreement applicable to Victoria as specified in the specific conditions for each Authorised Lottery set out in Annexure A.”

4. In **Annexure A** of the Category 1 Public Lottery Licence **insert** -

“

1. Name of the lottery: Keno

2. Summary of key aspects of the lottery, including:

(i) method by which winning entries will be determined (e.g. draw of balls, type and name of event(s));

In each draw 20 numbers are drawn from a drawing device containing 80 numbers from 1 to 80 inclusive.

- (ii) **number of balls or event 'winners' that determine the odds of winning and winning entries for the first prize and subsequent division prizes;**

A player's selection of between 3 and 10 numbers only from the numbers 1 to 80 inclusive constitutes a game. Winning entries for the first prize and subsequent prizes are determined by a player matching his/her selected numbers to the 20 winning numbers in that draw.

- (iii) **if the lottery is subject to a Bloc Agreement the names of the other licensees and the jurisdiction in which they are licensed to sell the lottery**

The lottery is not subject to a Bloc Agreement

- (iv) **the prize structure, such as the number of divisions for prizes; and**

The prize structure contains:

- (a) between 20 and 25 fixed prizes which are determined by the amount of numbers selected by a player (between 3 and 10) in conjunction with the amount of winning numbers selected by the player in that draw; and
- (b) a top prize which is set at a minimum amount and is a pari-mutuel prize and thus shared equally between all winners of that prize in a particular draw.

The legislated 'return to player' comprises the prize pool distributed in each respective draw for the fixed prizes and a reserve or jackpot prize pool which includes the amount of the top prize which increases or accumulates from the amounts remaining after all fixed prizes in a draw have been paid and is used to pay and guarantee the top prize.

Complete details of the prize structure are set out in the Public Lottery Rules.

- (v) **day/date and frequency of occurrence of the draw or event that will determine winning entries:**

The draw is conducted each day of the week in the evening every day year of the year.

- 3. Shortest possible period of time permitted between result of one lottery and re-purchase of an entry in the next draw/event of that lottery.**

Draw results are available at approximately 8:30pm on the night of the draw with minor prize payments and repurchase available the next day. All fixed prizes are available to be claimed on the day following the draw and the top prize is available to be claimed no earlier than 14 days from the date of the draw unless a shorter period is prescribed in the Public Lottery Rules.

5. Distribution restrictions (if any).

6. Maximum Permitted Frequency for the draw or Determination of the Authorised Lottery:

The Authorised Lottery must not be drawn or Determined more frequently than the period of time specified opposite it.

5. In Annexure A of the Category 1 Public Lottery Licence insert -

“Instant Authorised Lotteries

1. Name of the instant lottery: Instant Scratch-Its

2. Summary of key aspects of the lottery, including:

(i) the theme and images in the art work on the tickets/entries;

The artwork of Instant Scratch-Its games spans a number of themes. These may include seasonal themes such as Christmas, game themes such as crosswords or sudoku, and popular culture themes such as films or books.

(ii) the number of individual game panels on the ticket/entry to be scratched or revealed for the opportunity to win a prize;

A ticket in an Instant Scratch-Its Game may contain up to 25 game panels.

All tickets in a particular Instant Scratch-Its Game contain the same number of game panels.

(iii) the method(s) for determining if a prize has been won;

All Instant Scratch-Its Games are premised on scratching the latex covering on the game panel to reveal numbers, signs, symbols and/or dollar amounts which, when appearing in such combination or configuration specified in the instructions for the game panel, will win the prize specified for that game panel.

(iv) if the lottery is subject to a Bloc Agreement the names of the other licensees and the jurisdictions in which they are licensed to sell the lottery;

Certain Instant Scratch-Its Games:

(a) will be subject to an Instant Lottery Bloc Agreement with the parties being Tattersall's Sweeps Pty Ltd – Victoria, Golden Casket Lottery Corporation Limited – Queensland and New South Wales Lotteries Corporation Pty Ltd – New South Wales; and

(b) will not be subject to an Instant Lottery Bloc Agreement.

(v) the prize structure;

The prize structure for each Instant Scratch-Its Game is pari-mutuel, notwithstanding that all prizes available to be won are predetermined and fixed, whereby the total prize pool available and the number and value of individual prizes comprising it, is determined by the total number of tickets available for distribution and the price point denominations for those tickets.

The legislated 'return to player' comprises the total prize pool distributed in each Instant Scratch-Its Game and a reserve prize pool which accumulates across all Instant Scratch-Its Games which is used to guarantee and/or supplement any or all prizes (including bonus prizes where applicable) from time to time.

Instant Scratch-Its Games are available in a range of entry prices from anywhere between \$1 to \$50 inclusive, all of which feature an advertised 'top prize amount' of which there is usually one available to be won in each Instant Scratch-Its Game. Top prize amounts range from anywhere between \$25,000 to single or multiple top prizes of \$5,000,000, depending upon the entry price for the respective Instant Scratch-Its Game.

(vi) the number of prizes that can be won on each ticket/entry; and

An Instant Scratch-Its Game may contain up to 25 individual prizes on any one ticket.

(vii) whether a ticket/entry contains a bonus draw component and/or is played in conjunction with a specific event or occurrence;

An Instant Scratch-Its Game may contain a bonus game element or game panel where bonus prizes funded by the reserve prize pool are available to be won, whether on an 'instant scratch and win' basis or by reference to an event occurring or conducted at a later date including for example, a barrel draw into which eligible tickets are entered or a sporting event.

3. Distribution Approach / Points of Sale:

- Tattersall's full-offer retail outlets (and sub-outlets);
- Partial-offer retail outlets; and
- Convenience outlets.

4. Distribution restrictions (if any).

5. Maximum Permitted Frequency for the draw or Determination of the Authorised Lottery:

For the purpose of Instant Authorised Lotteries, the 'frequency for the draw or Determination' relates to the number of separate Instant Authorised Lotteries that are on sale at the one time.

Up to 15 Instant Scratch-Its Games may be available for sale at any point in time. The key aspects of each Instant Scratch-Its Game must be within the parameters of the key aspects of the lottery as describes in clause 2 above."
