Amendment to Category 1 Public Lottery Licence

1. Name of the lottery: Set For Life, (the Public Lottery conducted under the Bloc Agreement with the name of "Set For Life Bloc Agreement").

2. Summary of key aspects of the lottery, including:

(i) method by which winning entries will be determined (e.g. draw of balls, type and name of event(s));

In each draw ten numbers are drawn from a drawing device containing thirty seven numbers from 1 to 37 inclusive. The first eight numbers drawn are the winning numbers and the ninth and tenth numbers drawn are the extra numbers.

 (ii) number of numbers or event 'winners' that determine the odds of winning and winning entries for the 1st prize and subsequent prize levels 2 - 8;

A player's selection of eight numbers only from the numbers 1 to 37 inclusive constitutes a game. Winning combinations for each of the eight prize levels in a draw are as follows:

- 1st Prize– all eight winning numbers in any one game;
- 2nd Prize any seven of the eight winning numbers, plus one or both of the extra numbers, in any one game;
- 3rd Prize any seven of the eight winning numbers in any one game;
- 4th Prize any six of the eight winning numbers, plus one or both of the extra numbers, in any one game;
- 5th Prize- any six of the eight winning numbers;
- 6th Prize any five of the eight winning numbers, plus one or both of the extra numbers, in any one game
- 7th Prize any five of the eight winning numbers
- 8th Prize any four of the eight winning numbers, plus one or both of the extra numbers, in any one game

(iii) if the lottery is subject to a Bloc Agreement the names of the other licensees and the jurisdiction in which they are licensed to sell the lottery;

(iv) the prize structure, such as the number of prize levels for prizes; and

The prize structure is a mixture of fixed prizes and pari-mutuel with the legislated 'return to player' comprising the prize pool distributed in each respective draw and a reserve prize pool which accumulates and is used to guarantee 1st Prizes and/or supplement prizes in any or all prize levels from time to time.

1st Prize level comprises a fixed prize amount and a maximum prize per winning entry to be paid by 240 equal monthly instalments.

Each of the Prize levels 2 through 8 receives a percentage based allocation from the total prize pool available for distribution in that draw and all winning games in a prize level share equally in the prize pool for that prize level. Rules for rolling down prize level pools apply in circumstances for which there are no winning games in prize levels 2 through 8 in a draw.

(v) day/date and frequency of occurrence of the draw or event that will determine winning entries:

The draw is conducted on each day of the week, 365 days per year.

3. Shortest possible period of time permitted between result of one lottery and repurchase of an entry in the next draw/event of that lottery.

Draw results are available at approximately 9.30pm or soon thereafter on the night of the draw with repurchase available anytime thereafter.

6. Maximum Permitted Frequency for the draw or Determination of the Authorised Lottery:
