

## Guide to planning a fundraiser (minor gaming activity)

If you are planning a minor gaming activity to raise funds for your school, club, or organisation, you must be a declared community or charitable organisation with the Victorian Gambling and Casino Control Commission.

A minor gaming activity includes any activity involving payment to play and that relies on an element of chance such as raffles, bingo, and casino nights. If your activity relies on skill or judged, it is not considered a minor gaming activity.

If you are planning a minor gaming activity to raise funds on behalf of a community organisation or charity (i.e., Docklands Primary School or Cancer Council of Victoria), you need their written permission before proceeding.

The following outlines the requirements of schools, clubs, and organisations when it comes to fundraising activities involving minor gaming.

A minor gaming permit is required for certain activities. If you already have a minor gaming permit, check the conditions of your permit.
